



Curling Canada Scholarship Program 2026-2027 SCHOLAR AGREEMENT

The Scholar Agreement outlines the expectations and responsibilities of recipients of Curling Canada’s **For the Love of Curling** and **Fran Todd All Heart Scholarships**.

All Scholars are required to review and comply with this Agreement and the [Curling Canada Code of Conduct \(the “Code”\), linked here](#), which governs standards of behaviour and disciplinary processes.

This Agreement applies to Scholars for the full duration of their scholarship term (12 months from notification).

Scholars are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on Curling Canada at all times, including:

- During academic studies
- At sporting events and related activities
- In public settings
- On social media and other online platforms

Compliance with the Curling Canada Code of Conduct

All Scholars must comply with the [Curling Canada Code of Conduct, linked here](#), including all policies related to:

- Safe sport and maltreatment prevention
- Harassment, discrimination, and abuse
- Anti-doping requirements
- Respectful conduct and sportsmanship

Any behaviour that violates the Code will be considered a violation of this Agreement.



Scholar-Specific Expectations

In addition to the Code, Scholars are expected to meet the following requirements:

a) Academic Integrity

Scholars must demonstrate honesty and integrity in their academic pursuits, including:

- No cheating, plagiarism, or academic misconduct
- Compliance with all policies of their educational institution

b) Honesty and Representation

Scholars must:

- Provide accurate and truthful information to Curling Canada
- Not falsify, misrepresent, or omit relevant information related to their application or status

c) Respectful Conduct and Representation

Scholars are expected to:

- Represent Curling Canada in a positive and respectful manner
- Refrain from public statements or online activity that could reasonably harm the reputation of Curling Canada, its staff, or its programs

d) Social Media Conduct

As per Curling Canada's [Social Media Policy](#), use of social media must reflect the values of Curling Canada. Scholars must not:

- Engage in harassment, abusive language, or discriminatory behaviour
- Post content that is harmful, offensive, or damaging to others or to Curling Canada



e) Substance Use and Compliance with Laws

Scholars must:

- Comply with all applicable laws and institutional policies
- Adhere to all [anti-doping rules](#) and regulations
- Avoid the misuse of alcohol or other substances in any way that could negatively impact their conduct or reputation

f) Required Training

Successful applicants must complete the **Sport Integrity training program** within four (4) weeks of the Curling Canada scholarship announcement.

Failure to complete this requirement may result in withdrawal of the scholarship.

Where a potential violation of this Agreement occurs:

1. The Scholar will be notified of the alleged violation and may be asked to provide a written response.
2. The Scholarship Selection Committee will review the matter and determine appropriate action based on the facts and circumstances.
3. The Committee reserves the right to make decisions at its sole discretion and may request additional information or meetings as needed.

Where a potential violation of the Code of Conduct occurs:

1. The complaint will be managed through Curling Canada's Independent Third-Party process as per the organization's [Discipline and Complaints Policy](#).
2. By accepting the scholarship, Scholars acknowledge that they:
 - Have read and understand this Agreement
 - Agree to complete and comply with Curling Canada's Sport Integrity Program
 - Understand that failure to meet these expectations may result in disciplinary action, including loss of scholarship funding
